

## Employment: - Number of created Jobs in month of November 2013

A total number of 1116 jobs were created in the month of November 2013, the term “created” is limited to advertised jobs in formal press such as all published newspapers and job internet sites casting jobs in Rwanda. These included temporary and permanent jobs as is explained below.

In terms of sectors, there are 21 economic sectors (ISIC 08), most of the jobs were created in Education, Health services, Public administration, Information and communication, Professional, Scientific and Technical services, respectively, whereas the least number of jobs were created in Manufacturing, Accommodation and food service activities, and real estate activities, for details, see table below.

NB: ‘Other services means According to the ISIC classification, this is a main economic activity among 21 activities which includes the following sub’ activities: Washing and (dry Cleaning of textile and fur product), Hairdressing and other beauty treatment, Funeral and related activities.

## Permanent Jobs

1003 permanent jobs were created in the month of November, with public sector accounting for 78.0%, while the professionals were the most demanded for skilled labour units with a proportion of 60.4%, For details see tables (Table4) and (Table2) below.

In terms of ownership, the public sector created the most jobs with a proportion of 78.0%, NGO, 9.3%, Private sector 11.5% whereas the parastatal created 1.3% of the jobs, for details see table below.

## Temporary Jobs/Consultancy Jobs

A total of 113 temporary/ consultancy jobs were created in November with the public sector generating 48.7% of the jobs, private sector 3.5%, parastatal institutions 9.7% while NGOs 38.1%. All the created jobs required professionals with most requiring master's degrees in the respective areas.
